ACCESSIBLE HOLIDAY COTTAGES IN CORNWALL

As we are now in October we thought we'd drop you a line highlighting some recently visited attractions that guests have enjoyed.

[Paradise Park](#) in Hayle is a wildlife sanctuary and tourist attraction. The Park is family run and home to Operation Chough since 1987, and the World Parrot Trust registered charity from 1989. It has been praised highly for its beautiful gardens, well looked after animals and birds and its accessibility too. The Park is home to over 1,200 birds plus mammals including Red Pandas, Red Squirrels, Asian Otters, Harvest Mice plus the Fun Farm animals.



With the development of a Virtual Reality Tour by the Heritage Ability scheme [Geevor Mine](#) can now offer a more inclusive experience for wheelchair users and those with mobility issues. There have been very positive reviews about this development and it's a truly fascinating insight to Cornwall's mining heritage.



A holiday in Cornwall often features a trip to the coast or lakes where visitors can enjoy some time on the water. There is no shortage of boats that can now offer trips to wheelchair users too. [South West Lakes](#) at Stithians hire out wheely boats that can be used for some fly fishing, pleasure boating or for the more adventurous power boating!
